Profile in perseverance: Dr. Vanessa Rouzier

Born and raised in Haiti, Dr. Vanessa Rouzier completed her medical studies abroad and returned to her home country in 2009 as the Chief of Pediatrics at GHESKIO, where she now serves as Head of Research.

One of her most far-reaching successes was leading a cholera vaccination program in Port-au-Prince during the catastrophic 2010 cholera outbreak. Results were so significant that they prompted the World Health Organization to include cholera vaccination in its emergency prevention response to cholera outbreaks.

Dr. Rouzier is especially passionate about improving health among women and children living with HIV in Haiti and other resource-limited settings. Her expertise, commitment and humble demeanor make her a critical asset for GHESKIO.


In 2012, with the help of PRODEV and the Principality of Monaco, the Ecole Prince Albert II de Monaco primary school was built on the GHESKIO campus.
