GHESKIO By the Numbers: 2025

GHESKIO continued to deliver lifesaving care and support to the country's most vulnerable communities in 2025. Across nine internally displaced persons (IDP) camps serving more than 24,000 people, GHESKIO provided integrated medical, psychosocial, nutritional, and economic support to women, children, and families affected by violence and displacement.



In the face of violence, unrest and dangerous circumstances, GHESKIO's teams remained committed to ensuring continuity of care, dignity, and hope for Haiti's most vulnerable populations.

Letters from the Leadership at GHESKIO

2025 was another extraordinarily difficult year for Haiti and for GHESKIO. Ongoing insecurity led to further displacement, increased pressure on our health centers, and the continued departure of healthcare professionals from the country. Yet even in these conditions, GHESKIO remained committed to serving the most vulnerable. We continued caring for internally displaced families living in camps, sustained lifesaving HIV treatment for our patients, and expanded community-based care for chronic diseases such as hypertension. **Importantly, our community health workers demonstrated that even in times of crisis, consistent follow-up and treatment can significantly improve health outcomes and reduce the risk of heart attack and stroke.** Haiti's challenges remain immense, but so does the resilience of our patients, our staff, and our communities.

In 2025, the crisis in Haiti continued to fall heavily on women and girls living in displacement camps, many of whom have experienced profound trauma, including gender-based violence, loss, and extreme economic hardship. Beyond the immediate health consequences, we witnessed the deep emotional toll of insecurity, anxiety, depression, and the daily struggle to survive in conditions no person should endure.

Yet even in these circumstances, the strength and resilience of these women continue to inspire us. With support from the Haitian Global Health Alliance, GHESKIO provided integrated care that addressed not only urgent medical needs but also mental health support, education, and opportunities for economic empowerment. **We believe that restoring dignity and hope requires more than treatment alone—it requires investing in the whole person and creating pathways toward stability and recovery.**

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Looking Ahead

In the last half of 2026 and in 2027, we will be expanding our distance education program that enables early learners access to remote learning so that they don't fall behind in their studies. Children and their families work with GHESKIO's school to access technology tools that improve literacy and numeracy within the entire family. The pilot conducted in 2025 and 2026 demonstrated that GHESKIO can keep kids not only current with their studies, but ensure children receive the best education during their most formative years.

GHESKIO's vocational training program for women, has helped almost 10,000 women learn a marketable skill, access microcredit and learn how to run a small business. This provides opportunities for vulnerable women and those who have survived gender-based violence to learn a trade, become independent and rebuild their self-esteem.

Strengthening Impact Through Partnership

Through a close partnership, HGHA helps GHESKIO secure the resources needed to deliver lifesaving programs for women, girls, and internally displaced families. In 2025, HGHA-supported fundraising and proposal development efforts resulted in more than \$2 million in grant funding from foundations and competitive funding opportunities. Many of these awards were made directly to GHESKIO, while HGHA provided the donor relationships and proposal support behind the scenes. By allowing GHESKIO's healthcare professionals to focus on patient care, this partnership maximizes both impact and efficiency. Together, we aim to double this result in 2027.
